Part II: The One-Pager Poster


For one of the four books you are required to read, create a poster-sized one-pager. Your one-pager must be poster-sized. The poster must be at least 14 x 22 inches. These boards often come in packs of three from office supply shops. You may use a larger size. Also, you will need access to these materials: pens, pencils, markers, crayons, and/or paint (anything you could use for drawing and coloring). 
Poster Checklist: Your one-pager poster must include the following elements:

TITLE/AUTHOR: Write the title of the book and the author's full name somewhere on your poster.
QUOTATION/EXPLANATION : Copy a key quotation. Cite the page number. Explain why it is an important quote.
IMAGES/CAPTIONS: Include three images from the book. Your images may be hand drawn, printed from a
computer, or cut out of a magazine. Under each image, write a caption that explains the image. Your captions
may be quotations. Be sure to use quotation marks and cite page numbers if you use quotes. Your captions may
also be written in your own words. Make sure captions are proofread and written in complete sentences.
BORDER : Create a border using a key quotation from the book. Use quotation marks. Cite the page number.
THEME : Write what you believe is the main theme of the book and why you think so (theme=underlying
meaning or message).
TWO KEY WORDS : Copy and define two key words. Use dictionary definitions and include the part of speech.
PASSAGE: Quote and cite a passage (3-5 sentences) from the book and explain how you relate to it.
FAMILY CONNECTION: Write which family member might want to read the book and why.
COLOR/DESIGN: Use color and designs to liven up your poster.
NAME/GRADE: Write your full name and grade level (7) on the poster.
REVIEW : Review your poster with someone (another 7th grader), making sure you've included all elements.
TIME COMMITMENT: It should take you 2-4 hours to complete this project.
SUBMIT : Bring your poster to SLS on the second day of school.

You may type quotations, passages, and captions, write them out by hand, or do a combination of the two.
