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## AFTER SCHOOL PROGRAM (ASP)

### GENERAL CARE

The GENERAL CARE program runs from 2:35 - 6:00 p.m. and consists of a snack, free play, and homework time. This time is run by the after school staff.

### ENRICH

The ENRICH program offers enrichment classes in the areas of sports, arts, theater, and STEM. Two class sections will be offered on Mondays through Thursdays from 3:20 - 5:35 p.m. On Fridays, one class section will be offered from 2:45 - 3:45 p.m. Classes will be taught by both after school staff and outside consultants.

### MUSIC

The MUSIC program offers both private lessons and music groups. Private lessons are offered for all levels and range from 30 minutes to 60 minutes. This offers students the opportunity to express themselves through music and to grow their abilities through an individualized curriculum. Private lessons are scheduled by the music coordinator and will be taught by music instructors. Private lesson students may participate in one mini recital and the yearly music recital.

# ASP POLICIES AND PROCEDURES



## How to Register

Program details are emailed to parents prior to the start of each trimester. Parents may register their child via the online registration form.

## Payment and Enrollment Policies

A student is considered registered once an online registration form is completed. Fees for the ASP will be billed via each family's TADS account. All classes are filled on a first-come, first-served basis. Classes are offered contingent on enrollment. A \$25 late registration fee will be charged after the trial week. Families whose accounts are in arrears may *not* use the services of the After School Program or register for a new trimester until the Business Office clears their account.

## Trial Week

The ASP offers a trial week for all students interested in the ASP program. This is a great way for students to try a class. Trial week is the first week of the trimester. If a child remains in the program after the trial week, the parent will be responsible for the class fee and no refunds will be given. If a child decides not to continue after the trial week, the parent must inform the Director of After School in writing. The parent will only be charged for the trial week class(es).

## ASP Hours

The After School Program runs each full school day from 2:35 - 6:00 p.m.

## Sign-in and Sign-out Procedures

### **Registered Students Sign-in**

Students who are registered for a class will be signed in on their class day in the following way:

JK - Grade 4: Each Lower School teacher is given a roster indicating the after school activity for each student in their class. Students who have an after school class will be signed into the ASP by their teacher or ASP staff. If a child is absent or will miss the class, the teacher will inform the ASP staff. Parents are encouraged to daily review class schedules with their child(ren).

Grade 5 - 8: Each Upper School teacher is given a roster indicating the after school activity for each student in their class. Students may be in study hall until 4:35 p.m. or the start of their class. Students are responsible for getting to their class or lesson on time.

### **Sign-out**

Because we care deeply about the safety of each child, we ask for your cooperation in complying with the sign-out policy.

- Children may only be signed out by a parent or another adult on the child's approved pick-up list. If there are any changes to the list (i.e. caregivers), please inform the school office as soon as possible.
- Before a child leaves the premises, he/she needs to be signed out on the sign-out sheet. The adult should sign and indicate the time of sign-out. Upper School students may sign themselves out.

## Drop In

Children may join the ASP on an hourly basis. Drop ins will apply to students who are picked up late from regular dismissal or after their ASP class. It is important that we know about drop ins in advance whenever possible. Please send an email to the office ([office@stlukeschool.org](mailto:office@stlukeschool.org)), your child's homeroom teacher, and/or the After School Program staff ([afterschool@stlukeschool.org](mailto:afterschool@stlukeschool.org)). Drop-in charges will be billed monthly to each family's TADS account.

Lower School students who are picked up late and Upper School students who remain after school unsupervised will be sent to the ASP. A fee of \$15 per hour will be charged, up to a maximum of \$45 per child.

- **For students registered for a class**, general child care is provided from dismissal to 5:05 p.m. or the end of class (whichever is later). Drop in rates apply afterwards.
- **For students registered for a music lesson**, general child care is provided from dismissal until the start of the lesson. Drop in rates apply afterwards.

Students may drop in to the ASP at no cost for the reasons below. Please alert your child's homeroom teacher and the After School Director in advance:

- Siblings waiting for dismissal of an older child. Drop-in fees will apply after the older siblings' dismissal time.
- Children whose parents are volunteering for the school.
- Children whose parents are in a parent conference or meeting with an administrator.

# ASP POLICIES AND PROCEDURES (CONTINUED)

## Rates

**Drop-in Rate:** A fee of \$15.00 per hour per student will be charged, up to a maximum of \$45.00.

**Late Pick-up Rate:** The ASP ends at 6:00 p.m. There is an additional charge of \$1.00 per minute for any pick-ups after 6:00 p.m.

## Class Availability

Each class needs a minimum of 6 students in order to continue after the trial week. Some classes have a limited number of space and will be filled on a first-come, first-serve basis.

## ASP Study Hall, Mondays through Thursdays, 3:20 - 4:35 p.m.

Supervised independent work time (Study Hall) is offered so that students may work independently on homework. Group work is not permitted during this time. ASP (Lower School students must be accompanied by ASP staff) and Upper School students are welcome to work independently without a parent or caregiver. Please note: Not all children are ready to use supervised study effectively. Please discuss your family's needs and your child's homework routine with the After School staff so that we can assist you in developing a clear, predictable, and effective homework routine for your child.

*FEES FOR STUDY HALL USE:* Students in Grades 5 - 8 are allowed to use the ASP Study Hall **at no charge** until 4:35 p.m. Grade 5 - 8 students will be asked to leave the school campus or sign into ASP if they are being disruptive or if it's past 4:35 p.m. **If a student signs into ASP, drop-in charges will apply.** Lower School students who are not in the ASP and want to use the ASP Study Hall time will need to sign in to the ASP and drop-in charges will apply. Lower School students who are with a parent or caregiver while using Study Hall will not be charged a fee.

## ASP Playground and Auditorium

When weather permits, the ASP staff will open the playground for a period of time or may open the auditorium if it's available. After 3:25 p.m., the playground and auditorium are open **ONLY** when there is an ASP staff present. Only students who are in the ASP or are with a parent or caregiver may be on the playground. **If a student is on the playground without a parent or caregiver, they will be signed into ASP and drop-in charges will apply.**

## ASP Dining Room

When the playground is closed, ASP students are allowed to do homework, play games, or read in the dining room. From 2:30 - 3:35 p.m. the dining room is **ONLY** open to students who are in the ASP. Siblings and caregivers who are waiting for a student to be dismissed from their ASP class may wait in the dining room after 3:35 p.m. **All other students, including the Upper School or those with caregivers, must sign into ASP and drop-in charges will apply.**

# ST. LUKE'S SCHOOL - AFTER SCHOOL PROGRAM

## MUSIC Program

The MUSIC program consists of private and group lessons. Enrollment in the Music Program is for the full year.

### Spring Trimester Notes:

- \* Students already registered for music lessons do not need to reregister.
- \* Students interested in music lessons are welcome to enroll; however, early lesson times and lessons for piano and drums are limited.
- \* Fees will be prorated to reflect the number of lessons for the trimester.

### Private Lessons

Private lesson fees include books, 25 private lessons, participation in one mini and the yearly recital, and administrative fees. Please note that financial aid is not available for private lessons.

- \* 30 Minute Lessons: \$1800
- \* 60 Minute Lessons: \$2700

All private lessons will be scheduled by the ASP Music Coordinator. To inquire about availability, please contact the coordinator at [aspmusic@stlukeschool.org](mailto:aspmusic@stlukeschool.org). Any changes to your schedule and all cancellations MUST be communicated with the music coordinator.

### Make-up Lesson Policy

Make-up lessons are only given for the following reasons

- 1) The instructor is unavailable.
- 2) The parent gives notice of cancellation to the music coordinator ([aspmusic@stlukeschool.org](mailto:aspmusic@stlukeschool.org)) with at least 24 hours of notice.
- 3) The student attends school but goes home sick due to illness.
- 4) A lesson is missed due to an unscheduled school closing.

All other make-up lessons will be given at the rate of \$60 per half hour.

### Refunds and Enrollment Cancellation Policy


Students are enrolled for *one year of lessons*. The parent must be responsible for all lessons. Refunds will not be given for enrollment cancellations during the Spring trimester.
